

Homework Timetable 2022-23

Years 7 and 8

Students have three types of homework:

- Learning Tasks (30 minutes) set by the subject (see timetable below). These could include, but are not limited to: written tasks and exercises, reading, research, summarising, revising, learning and could be on paper or digital.
- Projects, where a number of homeworks over a series of weeks will be on a single task, or series of linked tasks, set in advance. Students will work on these projects on evenings where that would usually set tasks. Projects can be set by any subject. Some subjects will only set projects. Art and textiles will set one long project each per year.
- 'Things to do.' These are short tasks, which should take no more than 10 minutes and can be set to be done before the next lesson

Homework and relevant deadlines will be set using the Class Charts app.

NB: Students in different classes, even when they are on the same side of a year group, will have subjects on different days and different times. The table above indicates the day set aside for the completion of homework in each subject. The homework may be set earlier in the day which is allocated to that subject.

Years 9, 10 and 11

No homework timetable is published. Subjects are expected to set homework as detailed below. Written homework should be given with a full week for completion.

Year 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• One 30-minute homework per week in English, Maths, MFL, History, Geography as appropriate to individual students' curriculum• Science will be set three 20-minute homeworks per week (one for each lesson)• Perform and Create subjects will only set homework, independent work or preparation where it is appropriate, which may be in the form of longer projects• All other subjects will not set homework
Year 10 and 11	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• English and Maths – two homeworks per week• Science – three homeworks per week (one for each of Biology, Chemistry and Physics)• All other subjects – one homework per week (except Core PE)• Short learning and/or preparation tasks may also be set with shorter deadlines

Where applicable to Years 10 and 11, homework may be linked to preparation for exams, coursework or other assessment under controlled conditions. Such independent work may extend over several weeks. Students should plan and record preparation as appropriate.
